## Presidents Report for 19 September 2018



As I was away for Wednesdays meeting Geoff Logie-Smith kindly wrote the following report about the meeting. Thank you Geoff

14 members attended last Wednesday night's meeting and we had as our guest speaker Jackie Gleeson, Past President of RC Oakleigh and RAM's committee member. Jackie provided an update on Rotarians Against Malaria (RAM's). RAM was started in the early 1990s by Australian Rotarians concerned about the growing incidence of malaria as one of the major health threats in the World. Over

200 million people are infected worldwide by the parasite and half a million people are dying of the disease each year with over 70% being children aged under 7. RAM's programmes are currently focused in our Australian Pacific region namely Timor Leste, PNG and the Solomon Islands.

The prime aim of RAM's is the eradication of malaria worldwide with the objective of taking over from the great work Rotarians has achieved with the virtual the eradication of Polio. Current RAM's work is involved with education programmes into preventing the spread of malaria, provision of insecticide treated nets, the adopt- a-village programme, tools kits, birthing kits and most importantly research into providing an effective preventative vaccine.

We thank Jackie for giving us such an interesting and Informative update on the work that RAM's is doing in the eradication of malaria.

A couple of things that I asked Lou to comment on at the meeting.

The DG has sent an update on the fight against polio in PNG. Fifteen cases have been reported so a lot work still to be done. I commented on the fight against polio activities in last week's bulletin.

The district also advised that \$10.1m has been raised since the drought relief project was launched in conjunction with Channel 9.

I have mentioned it quite often but we do need to keep an eye on fundraising activities for the rest of the year so please volunteer where ever possible. MWCIS food pick up volunteers are always needed and please note the address for the food drop off has now changed.

The next board meeting will be on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> September.

I look forward to catching up with you all at the social night on Wednesday.
