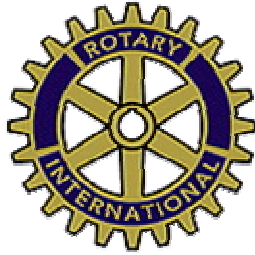

### **ROTARY DISTRICT ASSEMBLY (report compliments Miranda)**

The District Assembly kicked off with an engaging and inspiring presentation from incoming District Governor-Elect Russell Gurney who spoke about the vision and priorities for the 2018-19 year. He spoke of the importance of our clubs knowing our story and being able to tell it to anyone, and knowing our value, our mission and our vision.

He referred to "LEAP: an acronym for Love, Enthusiasm, Audacity and Proof. That is, to provide service above self with compassion (love), with energy (enthusiasm), by being bold (audacity) and by leading by example (proof).

He showed a clip from Incoming President Barry Rassin's Presidential speech "Be the Inspiration" and also quoted American pastor Robert H. Schuller "Spectacular achievement is always preceded by unspectacular preparation."

Incoming District Rotaract Representative Kai-Xing Goh then gave a motivating speech imploring Rotarians to become more actively involved and collaborate with Rotaract clubs. As she said, (paraphrasing) "We are the future leaders, we may not all be future Rotarians, but we are future leaders, and nothing will stop that", which received a resounding clap. Let's hope young leaders like Kai-Xing do transfer over to Rotary.

A really exciting moment for me in the plenary was when PDG David Alexander provided a Charitable Services Trust briefing and informed us that our district now has Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) status for specific major projects. As a fundraising specialist, I look forward to finding out how our Club can tap into this and having conversations with members about how we utilise this.

I attended the Public Image and Communications workshop sessions. There was a small attendance of approx ten people, all men and I could safely say all were approx sixty or over sixty. Some had considerable media and corporate communications experience, and all were keen to learn more about social media and how to strengthen our brand using it but also how to improve our reach with relevant traditional communications platforms. The co-facilitators informed us that they were looking for our input on where we think our clubs need help. They are working on a two-year project that focuses on strengthening the Rotary profile in our district. I'm excited!
