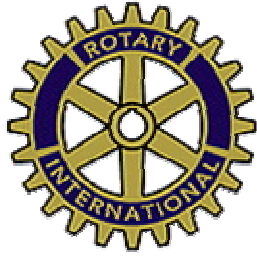

Presidents Report for 25 April 2018

This Wednesday is **ANZAC Day**, a day of reflection for all of us on the meaning of ANZAC and to pay tribute to those Australians who served and died in war and on operational duties both past and present.

In the April addition of '**Highlights of D9810**' our District Governor Malcolm Chiverton makes the following reference to District membership.. 'If you like being part of District 9810 and your Rotary Club, you need to act now. **JUNE WILL BE TOO LATE**. In the last few years we averaged losing 90-100 members a year in District 9810. For everyone reading this article, it is now time for you to ask someone to come along to a meeting or an event, not be left to the President or Membership Chair. Before you say I have asked all my friends, go back to the old way we used to get members, by their classification. How many Classifications are missing in your Club? When were they last asked to come along and see what you do?
