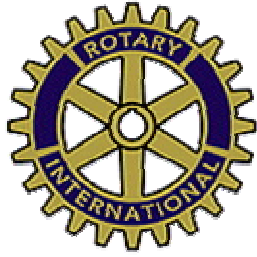

Presidents Report for 30 May 2018



We held our joint membership and volunteering forum last Wednesday along with the Rotary Clubs of Waverley and Monash. It was a great night and brought our three Clubs together in a joint gathering for membership awareness in Rotary and Community volunteering. The turnout was outstanding with well over 50 Rotarians, including 20 from our Club, their partners and friends, and several potential Rotarians, attended the evening and enjoyed the opportunity to meet and socialise.

Our guest speaker, Charles Kovess, spoke about developing strategies to capitalise on our passions and how we can share our passion as Rotarians with others in volunteering in our community.

Today, more than 200,000 Rotaractors are dedicated to making a difference on the issues that matter to our world and their communities.
